# Library Service for Yale Valley

## Will I have to pay for a card?

**No!** If you are a Yale Valley resident or property owner, you already have the right to receive a library card at no additional cost. YVLD contracts with Fort Vancouver Regional Library District for library services. Property owners pay for this arrangement through a property tax of no more than 50 cents per thousand dollars of assessed value.

## How do I get a library card?

- Visit any one of the 13 FVRL locations (Woodland and Battle Ground branches are closest to Yale) or the bookmobile.
- You'll need photo identification with your current street address (not a post office box). For more information on getting and using your FVRL library card, visit [www.fvrl.org/aboutus/library\\_card.htm](http://www.fvrl.org/aboutus/library_card.htm).

## How many books?

### How long may I keep them?

- Check out as many books as you like. The usual borrowing period is three weeks.
- Items may be renewed by:
  - 1)** calling 1-800-921-6211 **OR**
  - 2)** visiting the FVRL Web site at [http://www.fvrl.org/findbook/renew\\_book.htm](http://www.fvrl.org/findbook/renew_book.htm), **OR**
  - 3)** bringing them to any FVRL branch or bookmobile.

## Yale Valley Library District

### Background

In May 2003, citizens in the Yale precinct successfully voted to form a partial-county rural library district. As soon as the vote was successful, FVRL began providing library cards to citizens in the area. In April 2004, formal contracts between the Yale Valley Library District and FVRL were signed. Since tax collection would not start until January 2005, citizens raised funds to pay for interim bookmobile service to their area.

### Library Board

The Yale Valley Library District Board was established on July 9, 2003 with five members. Each member serves a five-year term, with one position reappointed each year. To establish this staggered schedule, four of the Board positions initially will be for reduced terms:

- Don Merkle** - term ends July 9, 2010
- Julia Stoll** - term ends July 9, 2006
- Kathi Wheeler, chair** - term ends July 9, 2007
- Patricia Joy Stepp** - term ends July 9, 2008
- Cynthia McAllister** - term ends July 9, 2009
