41st Annual Artists of the Gorge submissions now open

New entry procedures this year stress safety for artists, patrons, and library staff

STEVENSON, Wash. – Stevenson Community Library invites artists from Washougal to the Dalles to submit their work to the long-running Artists of the Gorge juried art exhibition by September 9 at 120 NW Vancouver Avenue, Stevenson, WA 98648.

In order to maintain a safe and healthy environment for our artists, patrons, and staff there have been some changes to this year's Call for Artists. First, as persons other than library staff are not currently allowed in the library building under Washington's "Safe Start" plan, *please call 360-906-4828 prior to coming to the library on the day you plan on delivering your work*; staff will meet you at the Gallery entrance on Columbia Street. They will have hand sanitizer and masks available for use during the intake process.

To continue this community event in uncertain times, the library is moving to an online exhibit format this year. The exhibit and traditional people's choice vote will be hosted on fvrl.org.

Supported by the Friends of Stevenson and North Bonneville Community Libraries, entry is free as always. The exhibition is open to all artists in the Gorge, Oregon and Washington residents from The Dalles to Washougal; artists must be 18 years or older. This event is open-themed. Paintings, drawings, sculpture, wood pieces, fabric art and other media will be considered. Entries must be recent (completed in 2019/2020) and original works. Copies, patterns, commercial art or class work is not accepted. Each artist may submit a maximum of two entries.

Jurors this year include:

- Lisa Conway (Ceramics): Chairperson of Art Department, Professor of Art and Ceramics Area Head, Clark College, Vancouver WA, 2003–Present
- Joy Kloman (Oils): Former University of Mississippi, Oxford, tenured associate professor, solely supervised painting and drawing, graduate and undergraduate programs. Also taught drawing in London, England. MFA University of Florida, BFA Kansas City Art Institute
- Warren Morgan (Photography): Retired editorial and commercial photographer. Landscape photographer
