

A STORY FOR EVERYONE: THE FREEDOM TO READ AND DEMOCRACY

Seventy years ago, a group from the American Library Association and the Association of American Publishers jointly crafted the Freedom to Read Statement in response to attacks on free expression. They reconvened on June 25, 2023, the 70th anniversary of writing the statement, to recommit to its principles. The statement begins with: The freedom to read is essential to our democracy. It is continuously under attack.

How does democracy depend on the freedom to read? Democracy relies on the ability of people to self-govern. To do so requires

citizens to be well-informed. Citizens have the right to seek and receive information from all viewpoints without restriction. Libraries provide free access to information and ideas allowing all sides of a question, cause, or movement to be explored. Armed with full knowledge, we can make a truly informed decision as participants in our democracy.

A fundamental belief of democracy and libraries is that people are capable of making information choices for themselves and have the right to do so, not to have others restrict those choices for them.




