

A truly great library contains something in it to offend everyone.

A STORY FOR EVERYONE: SOMETHING TO OFFEND AND SUPPORT ALL

"A truly great library contains something in it to offend everyone." It sounds like this is meant to be humorous, but it actually has a lot of seriousness to it. It speaks to the diversity of readers in America and the wide range of materials in U.S. libraries. But, books and other materials are being removed from libraries around the nation daily because they offend a person or a group of people. If we remove everything that offends someone, what will be left in the library? Will your favorite book, or the one you wanted to share with your child, still be on the shelf?

Will there be anything left?

Columbia County, Washington is facing a possible closure of their only library because disagreements over a few books prompted a citizen to file a petition to dissolve the library. Voters will decide the library's fate in November. This is one example of the possible results of censorship. Rather than have a library with books that offend some readers, they may have no library at all. When a library has something that offends everyone, it also has something that delights, supports, and represents everyone, too.


