

illustrated by Rebecca Lee Kunz and written by Andrea L. Rogers (Arthur A. Levine)




#### Home in a Lunchbox by Cherry Mo

#### <u>My Daddy Is a</u> <u>Cowboy</u> by Stephanie Seales




