### BOOKMOBILES REACH RURAL COMMUNITIES

On a sunny afternoon at Kadow Park, the Skamania/ West Klickitat Bookmobile slows to a stop. Within minutes, people begin to gather, drawn by the familiar sight.

Jeannie, Senior Library Assistant of Stevenson Community Library, calls out to a mother and two young children approaching the bookmobile, "I have the books you put on hold, and I added a few others that I think you might like!"

This joyful exchange is just one example of how FVRLibraries meets people where they are. With 15 libraries across 4,200 square miles of Southwest Washington, physical locations of our libraries remain out of reach for residents in rural areas—sometimes an hour's drive away or more. To help reach Tribal lands and remote locations, one of FVRLibraries' strategies is to bring books directly to communities through the bookmobile.

**FVRLibraries** bookmobiles prioritize access for all community members and both are equipped with lift devices in the back of the vehicle for patrons with accessibility needs.

This commitment to reaching rural communities has deep roots. "Library service for all" was the motto of Eva Santee, one of FVRLibraries' fiercest advocates and Clark County's first librarian to hold a master's degree. In 1941, Eva's vision became reality when she helped secure a Works Progress Administration grant to bring books to everyone regardless of where they lived. With this funding, an Army truck was repurposed as a bookmobile, and they hired a driver, librarian, and purchased books.

Nine years later, FVRLibraries officially became a library system and the bookmobile continued to service remote areas. And now as we celebrate the 75th anniversary of the FVRLibraries, the bookmobiles continue to roll on. We operate two bookmobiles in Skamania and Klickitat counties. and in 2024, these two bookmobiles made 890 stops and drove 22,341 miles combined.

These traveling libraries deliver far more than books, they offer free printing, Wi-Fi service, and community connection. Terra McLeod, Goldendale Community Library Branch Manager, shared a powerful story:

"We had a patron visit our bookmobile who needed help printing out forms so that she could apply for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. At a later date, the patron visited the bookmobile to expressly thank us for the resource and service."

The people who await each stop represent the full spectrum of our community—from curious children and busy young parents to book-loving adults and retirees with time to explore new authors.

"My son goes to Skamania School," said one bookmobile visitor. "His school is tiny so they do not have a library and the bookmobile visits every Thursday so that the kids can browse and check out books. ... A library in a bus, that's amazing!"







# **Phonic Bloom at Woodland Community Library**

Suspended above the Children's Reading Room at Woodland Community Library, Phonic Bloom is a one-of-a-kind sculpture created by Portland-based art studio Superfab. The artwork transforms the building blocks of human speech into a hanging garden made of recycled book pages and natural dyes—each petal and reed representing the many ways people speak and connect across cultures and generations.

Each flower in the sculpture represents a sound that makes up a word. The color of each flower was inspired by native plants in Southwest Washington and then assigned to one of the three languages spoken in Woodland:

- Blue tones: Cowlitz Salish
- Yellow and orange tones: Spanish
- Red tones: English

Phonic Bloom helps us see language not just as the words we say, but as shapes, colors, and connections. It celebrates the rich mix of voices that shape our region—and reminds us:

- Language is cultural—it carries stories and traditions.
- Language is learned—we gain it through listening and practice.
- Language is shared—it brings us together.




