

Bookmobile Guide for parents and caregivers

Partnering with schools and families

Public libraries help supplement the curriculum support provided by school libraries. One of the primary goals of public libraries is to help children develop a love of reading that will last throughout their lives.

Materials on board the bookmobile include a rich selection of leisure reading material. There are books on crafts, hobbies, pets, sports and other subjects of interest to people of all ages. Students may find items useful for completing homework assignments.

Your bookmobile driver can help you access most of the resources available in library buildings. We also encourage you to visit any library or contact us by phone or online to request materials.

Reading and learning together

Adults who read to children contribute a great deal to their language development and lifelong love of books and reading. We urge parents and caregivers to be involved in children's reading selections. We recognize that families have a right and responsibility to guide their own minor children in the selection of materials. Library staff will be happy to help you find materials that meet your family's needs.

The bookmobile contains a wide variety of materials for adults as well as children. FVRLibraries policy is that all materials are available to all users.

If you have special personal guidelines in mind governing your child's use of the bookmobile, please communicate these to your child and teacher or other responsible adult who will accompany your child to the bookmobile.

Borrowing library materials

Materials are checked out to the individual library card holder. Library card applications are available on the bookmobile, and drivers can issue cards. Children who use the bookmobile at school stops may be issued two cards: one card will be kept at the school; the other may be mailed to your child at home to be used during the summer or when you visit any library in person.

Books borrowed from the bookmobile may be returned to any FVRL library, bookmobile or remote book return. (See the list of locations on the back of this brochure.)

If necessary, overdue notices will be sent to the child at home. The library does not charge fines for overdue books, but we do assess replacement costs for lost or damaged materials. Please note that borrowers with \$25 or more in charges will not be able to check out additional library materials until lost items are returned or bills are paid.

You may renew library materials by calling your local library, or toll-free 1-800-750-9876 from area code 509. Please have your library card number handy when you call.

Using the library wherever you are

You can access the library at www.fvrl.org to search the catalog, place holds, renew items, and to use a wealth of online resources. The library offers eBooks, eAudio, movies, online courses, language learning, homework help and much more at no fee.

Bookmobile stops are your local link to the many resources of FVRLibraries.

There are books and magazines for all ages, best-sellers, answers to your information questions, story and craft programs for children, and much, much more.
